Without no seams nor needle-work

(Blankets and bedclothes the child of the mountain).

Am G . Am G . Am . G Am - - -

Then she'll be a true love of mine

(Sleeps unaware of the clarion call).

Am - G Am - C*

Tell her to find me an acre of land

(On the side of a hill, a sprinkling of leaves).

C Am C.D Am - - -*

Parsley, sage, rosemary, and thyme

(Washes the grave with silvery tears).

Am - C C . Bm . Am . G^F - Am*

Between the salt water and the sea strands

(A soldier cleans and polishes a gun).

Am G . Am G . Am . G Am - - -

Then she'll be a true love of mine

Am - G Am - C*

Tell her to reap it in a sickle of leather

(War bellows blazing in scarlet battalions).

(Generals order their soldiers to kill).
